professional library employee.



#### Teen Tech Week - March 4-10, 2007



The first Nevada Young Readers' Award was given in 1988 and ever since, the program has steadily grown to include more than 42,000 Nevada Young Readers' votes in 2006.

Participation of more readers also brings more nominations for the NYRA committee to read and consider. Dedicated librarians, teachers, and others read books, meet together, and decide upon the best of the best for the final list every year. The readers will gather across the state by teleconference on March 31, 2007 in order to select the final 2008 NYRA nominees.

The year 2007 marks the 12<sup>th</sup> year that Perma-Bound Books is a major sponsor of the Nevada Young Readers award. With Perma-Bound's help, NLA hosts the award winning authors and students at a gala event during the NLA conference, to be held this year in October in Carson City.


The NLA Scholarships Committee met in June to evaluate and rank eligible scholarship applicants. The following amounts were awarded:

Total:	\$21,500
University of North Texas (matching funds)	\$5000
IMLS (leftover amount from last round of awards)	\$6500
LSTA (for library certification students)	\$5000
McPhee/NLA Scholarship	\$5000

Additional IMLS monies were made available (thanks to Sara Jones!) and we were able to award them to eligible applicants in the amount of \$29,878.

#### Northwest District Annual Report Mona Reno, Chair

The Northwest (NW) District had a successful pair of speakers at the NLA Conference in North Las Vegas. On Thursday afternoon Teri Mark, the Nevada State Records Manager, presented "When Space is Scarce." On Friday afternoon May Tang, R.D., University of Nevada Cooperative Extension presented "Nutrition and Stress." Both presentations attracted over 50 people each and were received with attentive, involved and questioning audiences.
